
Huddersfield Pétanque Club Marsh Gates, Greenhead Park, HD1 4LA



We have 2 terrains - one is 30m by 12m and the other is 14m by 14m. We have 15 lanes generally 3m wide and 3 different surfaces ranging from benign to rough.

The terrain is at the northernmost point of the park 50m from a set of iron gates near a pub called the Junction. Very good range of real ales.

There is no dedicated parking so you have to park on street and it sometimes becomes crowded. Leave 10 extra minutes for parking if you can.

The club has a clubhouse with power and coffee making facilities. We can shelter about 40 people if it rains in the clubhouse and storage shed.

There are public toilets next to the park café within 80 metres. The pub also has toilets.

The club has many plastic garden chairs & tables and half a dozen park benches.

Playing days are Sunday, Tuesday and Thursday at 1pm. We welcome visitors and beginners.

From M62

Junction 23 and go towards Huddersfield down a very long hill for 2 miles. At the second roundabout just after the petrol station turn right and you'll see park gates on your left.

Junction 24 towards town centre for 2 miles. Turn right at 3rd traffic lights on to Edgerton Grove Road and at roundabout go straight ahead to see Park entrance.

From Town Centre

Use the ring road and turn up Trinity Street where old Huddersfield College used to be. Keep going up to the roundabout the turn left to see Park entrance.

By Train

Huddersfield is on the main transpennine route with frequent trains from Leeds, Wakefield and Manchester. Turn right outside station up St Georges Street onto Westgate and walk up to where Trinity Street meets ring road. Cross over and keep going up Trinity Street. It's nicer to walk through the park to the northern end than Trinity Street. It's a 15 minute walk.

By Bus

Many buses go from many places to different gates of the Park. See more at www.wymetro.com It's about 15 minutes walk from the town centre bus station. Busses from Huddersfield Bus station to Halifax like the 503 run every 20 minutes.

Parking

It's not easy. It's all on street and some is time limited but it is free. Allow a few extra minutes if you're attending a special event.

Park Drive. Disabled bays at the northern end very near the terrain and a few spaces that are rarely free. 3 hours limit most of the road. Start looking for a place here. It's one way so enter from Trinity Street near the south eastern corner of the park or Vernon street a little higher up.

If it's full turn left and go down **Gledholt Road** and start looking for a place on the left. If you haven't seen one by the time you get to **Quarry Road** (first on right) then turn right and shortly after right again onto **Grasmere Road** where there should be places. If not bear right onto **Clifton Road** and I've always found a place here. **Grasscroft Road** is also worth a look. **Park Drive South** often has places but it's a long walk through the park to the terrain. There's no public car park within a mile.
